**MAHEC Announces Program to Cultivate Student Interest in Health Careers** 

Program made possible by grant from the North Carolina GlaxoSmithKline Foundation

(Asheville, North Carolina; September 2024): MAHEC—Mountain Area Health Education Center—has been awarded a grant from the North Carolina GlaxoSmithKline Foundation totaling \$764,250 over a three-year period, which will be instrumental in the development and establishment of a program to cultivate interest in health profession careers among young people.

The Pathway Recruitment/Rural Exploration Program (PREP) will focus on high school, community college, and undergraduate students with activities that include:

- The Passport Program, a structured set of independent exploration opportunities
- Immersion trips to community colleges as well as local and statewide colleges
- Health career fairs and expos
- Mentorship programs for MAHEC professionals, UNC Health Sciences students, and alumni to guide community college students interested in health careers, providing insights, advice, and support

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, it is projected that employment in healthcare occupations at a national level will experience more growth than in other occupations over the course of the next decade. An average of around 1.8 million openings per year are expected through 2032, and an accompanying increase in healthcare support occupation opportunities can be expected.

In addition, North Carolina is projected to become the 7th most populated state in the country within the next 10 years, which will impact the overall employment landscape as well as the need for a well-trained healthcare workforce that understands distinctive regional challenges and complexities.
