MAHEC Commemorates the Life and Legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

Awards presented to staff who exemplify Dr. King's spirit

(Asheville, North Carolina – January 13, 2023) MAHEC commemorated the life and legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. at the organization's annual Spirit of Martin Luther King, Jr. Award Celebration on January 12, 2023. The much-anticipated centerpiece of the event was the announcement of winners of the coveted Spirit of MLK Award, the Emerging Leader Award, and a special Lifetime Achievement Award. The following are this year's award-winners:

Spirit of MLK Award: Eduardo Fabian Moreno, MS, LCMHC

Bilingual Mental Health Professional Center for Psychiatry and Mental Wellness



Eduardo Fabian Moreno was selected as this year's employee who most exemplifies Dr. King's spirit. A first generation Mexican-American on one side and a Western North Carolinian on the other, Moreno works with both English and Spanish speaking children, families, and adults dealing anxiety, depression, and trauma- and stress-related disorders.

According to Moreno's nominator, "Eduardo speaks up (in the most kind, gentle and affirming way) for so many historically excluded identities...advocating for people from different racial and ethnic groups, gender identities, neurodiverse people, and differently-abled people. It is refreshing and inspiring to witness Eduardo's commitment to improve service delivery to ALL at MAHEC."

Emerging Leader Award: Elisabeth Wallace, MSIS

Health Sciences Education Librarian



The Emerging Leader Award recognizes rising stars who serve as instruments of change at MAHEC and in the community. This year's changemaker is Research Librarian Elisabeth Wallace, who according to her nominator, "demonstrates her commitment to DEI work at MAHEC in clear and, often, quiet ways. She shows up and supports various efforts; for example, the annual MLK celebration, DEI training of residents and MAHEC employees, sharing of articles and learning opportunities with the DEI committee and other stakeholders, supporting NCAHEC Community Health Workers program as librarian – helping to ensure this work is grounded in emerging best practice and evidence.
